Extracted from § 114 of City of Whitehall Ordinances: Yard Sales and Garage Sales

Garage sales shall mean and include all sales entitled “garage sale,” lawn sale,” “attic sale,” “rummage sale,” “flea market sale,” or any similar casual sale of tangible personal property which is advertised by any means whereby the public at large is or can be made aware of said sale.

Goods are meant to include any goods, warehouse merchandise, or other property capable of being the object of a sale regulated hereunder.

Person shall mean and include individuals, partnerships, voluntary associations, and corporations.

It shall be unlawful for any person to conduct a garage sale at a single family residence or a duplex unit in the City without first filing with the clerk the information hereinafter specified and obtaining from such clerk, a license to do so, to be known as a “Garage Sale License.” The fee for such license shall be one (\$1) dollar.

Such license shall be issued to any one household unit, only one time with a twelve-month period, and no such license shall be issued for more than two (2) consecutive calendar days.

Each license issued under this ordinance must be prominently displayed on the premises upon which the garage sale is conducted throughout the entire period of the licensed sale.

Permitted sales shall only be held between the hours of 8:00 am to 5:00 pm; provided, however, no such sale shall be permitted on any Sunday or holiday; and provided, further, that no public street or right-of-way shall be used for the conduct or for the advertisement of any such sale.

No advertising of said sale shall be done by posting of signs on telephone poles, power poles, trees, traffic signs, or in any manner within the street right-of-ways.

Summary Highlights (in layman’s terms):

- Need a garage sale permit (license) – fee is \$1
- Need license on premises
- Each household may have one garage sale in a 12-month period for a maximum of two consecutive days – no Sundays or Holidays.
- Sales are permitted from 8 am – 5 pm
- No advertising on telephone poles, trees, traffic signs or with street right-of-ways
