CITY OF WHITEHALL CITY COUNCIL WORK SESSION MINUTES Garden Room January 11, 2022 5:00 p.m.

PRESENT: Scott Brown, Dick Connell, Keith Heidelberg, Sean Mullally, Steve Salter, and Steve Sikkenga ABSENT: Jeff Holmstrom

ALSO PRESENT: Scott Huebler, Brenda Bourdon, Roger Squiers, and Will Meier.

Mayor Salter called the meeting to order at 5:01 p.m.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

Senior Millage – Brown requested that part of the senior millage funds be allocated to the Senior Center instead of it all going to the Viking Athletic Center (White Lake Area Comm Ed). He expressed discontent that the WLACE has not yet provided the services/programs that the money was supposed to make possible. Huebler explained that the general fund can handle the \$2,500 allocation to the senior center and due to the pandemic, WLACE was hampered from creating new programs. Huebler was tasked with providing numbers and cost/fees associated with both the Senior Center and the Viking Athletic Center.

Lunches, Memberships, and Training – Brown believes that the taxpayers should not be paying for city employee training, memberships, or lunches for the BLT board. Huebler and Bourdon explained the importance of training for employee effectiveness and the memberships make it possible for additional learning opportunities, group forums, networking, and reduced and eliminated fees for training. Salter felt the small amount of money spent on lunches for BLT which has non-paid board members meet during lunch is a warranted expense.

Manager's Contract – Brown is not satisfied with the City Manager's contract and feels he's overpaid. Heidelberg through a series of questions on city performance maintained that the City Manager is doing his job well and is satisfied with his performance. Huebler explained that a recent salary survey of area City Managers showed his pay is slightly below average. Others expressed satisfaction with the City Manager's performance and consensus was to move forward with extending his contract.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Comments were received from the public which included sidewalk snowplowing and the possibility of getting a volunteer group to help those that have difficulty clearing their sidewalks.

- WHEREAS, the final pre-bid construction estimate was \$1,679,350.

WHEREAS, the City solicited for and received the following bids,

Hallack Contracting (Hart)\$1,594,084.81White Lake Excavating (Whitehall Twp)\$1,640,567.50McCormick Sand (Twin Lake)\$1,749,462.00Schippers Excavating (West Olive)\$1,911,611.50Wadel Stabilization (Hart)\$1,996,523.00Kamminga & Roodvoets (Grand Rapids)\$2,303,709.40

- WHEREAS, the low bid plus engineering fees brings this project to a total cost of \$1,817,985.
- WHEREAS, the Tax Increment Finance Authority has approved an additional \$247,740 and staff is recommending an appropriation of \$100,000 from the Major Street Fund Balance of \$525,000 towards this project.
- WHEREAS, \$290,000 will be requested in the FY 2022/23 budget from the Sewer and Water funds to complete the financing.
- WHEREAS, city staff and the City engineer have reviewed the bids with a recommend that the bid be awarded to Hallack Contracting

THE CITY OF WHITEHALL EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT EXTENSION

This Extension is made effective the 25th day of January, 2022 by and between the **City of Whitehall**, a Michigan municipal corporation ("City") and **Scott K. Huebler** ("Employee") with reference to the following facts:

Background

A. The City and Employee entered into an Employment Agreement on August 25, 2015 ("Agreement") by which the City employed Employee as its City Manager. The Agreement is in full force and effect as of the date of this Extension.

B. The term of the Agreement is for seven years, ending on August 25, 2022. Section 4 of the Agreement provides that term of the Agreement will be extended for an additional term of three years in the event written notice is not given by either party 180 days prior to the termination date.

C. At the request of Employee, the City Council approved a three-year extension of the Agreement at its meeting on January 25, 2022. The parties now desire to extend the term of the Agreement until August 24, 2025.

Therefore, for valuable consideration, the parties agree as follows:

1. **Extension.** The term of the Agreement is extended for three years from the original termination date of August 24, 2022. The new termination date of the Agreement is August 24, 2025.

2. **Full Force and Effect.** Except as set forth in this Extension, the Agreement between the parties dated August 25, 2015 is in full force and effect.

1. Title 6, Chapter 67 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Whitehall, Michigan, Sections 67.04 is amended to read as follows:

Failure to register within the prescribed time period shall result in a penalty fee as established from time to time by the City Council.

Rental Registration Fee and Rental Inspection Fee shall constitute a lien on the property and improvements, effective at the same times and enforceable in the same manner as general property taxes.

2. This Ordinance is to become effective ten (10) days after publication.
