Michigan Sparks Grant Program – Huebler provided information on the SPARKS Grant program that will award \$65M in three rounds over the next two years. No local match is required and the first round of applications are due December 19. Staff is recommending an application be submitted to address the repair and maintenance needs of Funnell Field in compliance with the Parks and Recreation Master Plan draft. It would include replacing restroom facilities, new play structures, resurfacing the basketball courts, and repairing and expanding parking at an estimated cost of \$405K. Council was in agreement with the recommendation.

Employee Insurance – Huebler provided an update on the annual review of the city's health care plans.

Climate Action Plan – Huebler provided an update on the progress of the plan and a recommendation to improve the pace of the project. He would like to retain Karoline Glamzi, a University of Michigan major in Earth & Environmental Sciences to coordinate with staff and a citizen task force to complete the plan. She would receive a \$1,000 scholarship. Council was in agreement with the recommendation.

Solar Picnic Table Charging Station – Huebler received a quote of \$14,765 to provide wireless service in Goodrich Park that would enable use of the solar picnic table. Some council members showed no interest in relocating the table from its current position.
