There will be a special election on **May 7th**, **2024** with a proposal from the White Lake Fire Authority on the ballot. All registered voters for the City of Whitehall vote at City Hall, 405 E. Colby Street. Polls open at 7 a.m. and close at 8 p.m. All voters have the option to vote early by mail (absentee voting). To register to

vote, see a sample ballot, or receive an absentee voter application, visit the Michigan's Voter Information Center online at www.mi.gov/vote or contact your clerk. There will not be 9 days of early voting for special elections, only State and Federal elections in even years.

Leaf Pick-up

The Spring Leaf Removal Program is scheduled to begin **April 14**th and go through **April 28th.** Guidelines are:

- Leaves cannot be bagged. Please rake them to the edge of the pavement where they will be collected.
- If you have a curb and gutter, leaves must be raked over the curb into the street.



- Make sure sticks are not mixed in with the leaves because they clog and damage the vacuum machine and may cause the entire pile to be left behind.
- Every effort will be made to pick up leaves once per week depending on the weather, amount of leaves, and holidays.

Brush Pick-up

Spring brush pick-up is scheduled to begin **May 6th.** Please stack neatly at the curb or street edge, butt ends to the street, no longer than four feet in length, and no larger than three inches in diameter. There will be only **one pass** through the city so brush put out late may not be picked up. To ensure pickup, please have your brush out by April 30th.

Hydrant Flushing

The Department of Public Works will be flushing water mains, through fire hydrants, **April 15 - April 26** between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

There may be some discoloration in your tap water during this time. If this occurs, open your water taps until the discolored water and/or air clears the lines. Your help and cooperation are greatly appreciated.


