

There will be a Primary Election on August 6, 2024. To see a sample ballot and find out if and where you are registered to vote, check out www.michigan.gov/vote. A sample ballot is also available for viewing at City Hall.

All registered voters for the City of Whitehall vote at City Hall, 405 E. Colby Street. Polls open at 7 a.m. and close at 8 p.m. Also now available is early voting. Residents of Whitehall may vote early starting July 27th at the




Muskegon County campus at 1905 Marquette Ave. Signs will direct you to the location in the student center.

"For Love of the Game"

Summer property taxes are due by July 31, 2024. Payment must be received on or before July 31 to avoid penalties postmarks are NOT accepted. Applications for summer 2024 tax deferments are currently being accepted for the eligible taxpayers who are 62 years of age or older, paraplegic, quadriplegic, service person, veteran, widow or widower or blind. To qualify, taxpayers must certify that their gross household income for the preceding calendar year did not exceed \$40,000.

Beware of Scams-Protecting Your Home from Fraudulent Practices



Dear Residents,

Lately, there has been a disturbing trend of fraudulent companies targeting individuals who are behind on property taxes or facing the threat of foreclosure. These companies prey on vulnerable homeowners, promising relief but delivering only further financial suffering and possible loss.

It's important to exercise caution and skepticism if you're approached by companies offering assistance with your property tax or foreclosure issues. Many of

these companies operate with the sole intention of scamming homeowners out of their homes and hard-earned money. It's crucial for all of us in the city to be aware of these scams and take proactive measures to protect our homes and our financial well-being. If you find yourself in a situation where you're struggling with property taxes or foreclosure, please know that there are legitimate avenues for assistance.

The Muskegon County Treasurer's office, reachable at (231)724-6261, can offer support and guidance to help you explore options to prevent tax foreclosure and find a way forward that works for you.

If you've already been contacted by such companies, please contact our police department or a trusted legal advisor before making any commitments. Understanding the potential consequences and verifying the legitimacy of these offers can save you from falling victim to fraud and protect the ownership of your home.

Together, let's remain vigilant and informed, ensuring that we don't become victims of deceptive practices. By knowing our options and seeking assistance from trusted sources like the Whitehall Police Department, the Muskegon County Treasurer's office and legal advisors, we can protect our homes and our community from fraud.
